#### ABOUT THE PROJECT & PROPOSALS

- A total of 10 topics were identified based on community,
   RCRJP Steering Committee, and Hayward City Council input to date.
- Implementation proposals will build on what has been shared.
- The details of the proposals will primarily be based on input from the town halls and 16-day public input processes.
- Qualitative data analysis will be used to identify priorities.



#### PROJECT BACKGROUND

 On November 16, 2021 – Hayward City Council voted unanimously to approve the resolution to apologize to Black, Indigenous, Latinx, and people of color community for the City's implicit and explicit role in perpetuating institutional racism.



#### PROJECT BACKGROUND

January 29, 2022 – During the City of Hayward Strategic
Roadmap prioritization session, Council directed staff to work
with the survivors and descendants of Russell City (regardless of
race) to determine appropriate restitution through a
community-led process.



#### PROJECT BACKGROUND

 On March 26, 2024 – Hayward City Council has a work session with the Russell City Reparative Justice Project (RCRJP) Steering Committee to receive draft recommendations. Council directed staff to narrow down the proposed recommendations, expand community input, and give scalable options for reparative justice recommendations.

# From List of Recommendations Compensation and Support for Russell City's Former Residents: Guaranteed Basic Income (GBI) for living former residents of Russell City. From RCRJP Steering Committee Addendums Repair the financial damage caused by a lack of infrastructure, government land grab, eminent domain, and long-term effects on residents and their descendants.



#### THINGS TO CONSIDER

- Definitions of General Basic Income or Guaranteed Basic Income may vary depending on the industry.
- For the purposes of the RCRJP, the community should specify its intention with this proposal.
- Some industries use basic income to refer to regular payments to a defined group.
- Some programs have a model that requires a qualifying income, others do not.

Property Restoration and Fair Compensation in Russell City: For owners unable to reclaim their lands due to existing infrastructure or businesses, compensation must be provided at the full 2023 market value. Additionally, for lands currently under lease to companies, redirecting leaseback payments to the original owners or their descendants is a just course of action.	Repair the financial damage caused by a lack of infrastructure, government land grab, eminent domain, and long-term effects on residents and their descendants.
	Retroactive Payment of Relocation Fees to All Displaced Former Residents of Russell City.
	Funding support for former business owners and their descendants to compensate for losses in business earnings, future earnings, and generational wealth.
	Repair the harm resulting from the impact of the "land grab" by the government and its long-term effect on the wealth and wellbeing.
