PROJECT BACKGROUND

On November 16, 2021:

 Hayward City Council voted unanimously to approve the resolution to apologize to Black, Indigenous, Latinx, and people of color community for the City's implicit and explicit role in perpetuating institutional racism.



PROJECT BACKGROUND

In January 2022:

 During the City of Hayward Strategic Roadmap prioritization session, Council directed staff to work with the survivors and descendants of Russell City (regardless of race) to determine appropriate restitution through a community-led process.



PROJECT BACKGROUND

On March 26, 2024:

- Hayward City Council had a work session to receive 26 draft recommendations and addendums from the Russell City Reparative Justice Project (RCRJP) Steering Committee.
- Council directed staff to narrow down the proposed recommendations, expand community input, and give scalable options for implementing reparative justice recommendations.



ABOUT THE PROJECT & PROPOSALS

- The 26 recommendations were consolidated to 10 topics based on community meetings, RCRJP Steering Committee feedback, and Hayward City Council.
- Implementation proposals will build on feedback to date, by clarifying the goals and scale of what is being proposed for a City Council decision.
- Implementation proposals will be based on input from town hall meetings and public input processes (20 days each).



MEETING GOALS

- Collect community input to inform the development of reparative justice implementation proposals.
- Qualitative data analysis will be used to identify priorities.



PROPOSAL 7: BUSINESS GRANTS & ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

From List of 26 Recommendations

Employment and Economic Opportunities: Grants for entrepreneurship should be extended to descendants irrespective of their location. Concurrently, businesses operating in the Industrial Park area of Hayward should be encouraged to create job opportunities specifically for these descendants.

Infrastructure Development: Restoration requires more than just returning lands; it calls for equipping those lands with modern amenities and services to ensure residents and their descendants can build a prosperous future.

Restitution for Denial of Infrastructure and Community Base: The term 'infrastructure' encompasses more than tangible assets like sewers or roads. It includes the backbone of a thriving community: schools, healthcare facilities, parks, and other social amenities. Historically, Russell City faced not just a physical but also a socio-cultural infrastructural deficit, impacting generations. Lack of essential services like sewers magnified the social and economic divide, making it an issue of generational wealth. Hence, proper restitution for these systemic denials is not just desirable but necessary.



PROPOSAL 7: BUSINESS GRANTS & ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

From RCRJP Steering Committee Addendums

Return the land, if not provide alternate City-owned land, for Russell City business owners and/or their descendants.

Center an understanding of redlining during and following the Russell City Development Project (1963 – 1968), including the impact of restrictive covenants on housing and business owner options for Black people displaced from Russell City.

Business owner residents and their descendants should be provided the opportunity to and funding/compensation to restore/repair/repay for the loss of finances generating income by way of their family business.

Give resources to create or restart businesses that can be a pathway to growing and recreating generational wealth.

Reclaim City-owned land for displaced businesses and organizations with partial funding from tax and fee monies generated and collected from the current occupants of illicitly obtained land from the former Russell City Residents.







HOMEBUYER'S ASSISTANCE

FOR CONSIDERATION

 Alameda County has a downpayment program that provides down payment assistance loans to eligible, middle-income, first-time homebuyers to facilitate the purchase of owneroccupied homes in Alameda County, and other homeowner assistance programs.

HOMEBUYER'S ASSISTANCE

FOR CONSIDERATION

- The City of Hayward does not currently have a downpayment assistance program.
- Hayward City Council allocated \$2 million of American
 Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds for downpayment assistance.
- The program will be required to comply with federal requirements and will likely be implemented next year providing approximately 9 loans to low-income households.
